## Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ June 14, 2020

Reading I:  
Deuteronomy 8:2-3,14b-16a  
Responsorial Psalm:  
147:12-13,14-15,19-20  
Reading II: 1 Corinthians 10:16-17  
Gospel: John 6:51-58

Theme: *"This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate*

*and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever"* (Gospel).

Some of you sobbed as you received the body of Christ for the first time since the lockdown. I could feel your joy and sense of relief as you received again our Lord in the Holy Eucharist after two months of deprivation. It is already a terrible experience to be isolated, but it is spiritually grueling not to participate in the celebration of the Holy Eucharist. Indeed, we hunger and thirst for the Lord.

As we celebrate today the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, we thank Him for the gift of the Holy Eucharist. It is central and necessary to sustain our faith, love, and devotion to God who provides both physical and spiritual nourishment. *"Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day"* (John 6:53). With the words of our Lord Jesus Christ, we do not need any other words to explain what he meant in receiving Him in the Holy Eucharist.

Eternal life is a big promise and we trust our Lord who rose from the dead. With so many social issues that add anxiety and stress to a terrible situation, we hold on to the faith in Christ who tells us that with God, we need not fear anything. It does mean that we be careless and unmindful of the safety and protection, rather it means being confident and hopeful that in God's own time, all will be well and peaceful.

As Christians, we arrange everything in our life around God who generates spiritual energy and motivation. The Holy Eucharist is God's physical presence. *"The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch"* (Catechism of Catholic Church 1324).

Let us pray: God the Father, thank you for sending us your Son Jesus Christ, our Savior and Eucharist through the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever, Amen.

## Solemnidad del cuerpo y sangre de Cristo 14 de junio de 2020

Lectura I: Deuteronomio 8: 2-3,14b-16a  
Salmo responsorial: 147: 12-13,14-15,19-20  
Lectura II: 1 Corintios 10: 16-17  
Evangelio: Juan 6: 51-58

Tema: *"Este es el pan que descendió del cielo. A diferencia de tus antepasados que comieron y aún murieron, quien coma este pan vivirá para siempre"* (Evangelio).

Algunos de ustedes lloraron cuando recibieron el cuerpo de Cristo por primera vez desde el cierre. Pude sentir tu alegría y alivio al recibir nuevamente a nuestro Señor en la Sagrada Eucaristía después de dos meses de privación. Ya es una experiencia terrible estar aislado, pero es espiritualmente agotador no participar en la celebración de la Sagrada Eucaristía. De hecho, tenemos hambre y sed del Señor.

Al celebrar hoy la solemnidad del cuerpo y la sangre de Cristo, le agradecemos por el don de la Sagrada Eucaristía. Es fundamental y necesario mantener nuestra fe, amor y devoción a Dios, que nos proporciona alimento tanto físico como espiritual. *"Amén, amén, te digo que, a menos que comas la carne del Hijo del Hombre y bebas su sangre, no tienes vida dentro de ti. El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre tiene vida eterna, y yo lo resucitaré. en el último día"* (Juan 6:53). Con las palabras de nuestro Señor Jesucristo, no necesitamos otras palabras para explicar lo que quiso decir al recibirlo en la Sagrada Eucaristía.

La vida eterna es una gran promesa y confiamos en nuestro Señor que resucitó de entre los muertos. Con tantos problemas sociales que agregan ansiedad y estrés a una situación terrible, nos aferramos a la fe en Cristo que nos dice que con Dios no debemos temer a nada. Significa que seamos descuidados y despreocupados por la seguridad y la protección, más bien significa tener confianza y esperanza de que, en los tiempos de Dios, todo estará bien y en paz.

Como cristianos, organizamos todo en nuestra vida alrededor de Dios, que genera energía espiritual y motivación. La Sagrada Eucaristía es la presencia física de Dios. *"La Eucaristía es la fuente y la cumbre de la vida cristiana. Los otros sacramentos, y de hecho todos los ministerios eclesiásticos y las obras del apostolado, están vinculados con la Eucaristía y están orientados hacia ella. Porque en la bendita Eucaristía está contenido todo el bien espiritual de la Iglesia, es decir, Cristo mismo, nuestra Pascua"* (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica 1324).

Oremos: Dios Padre, gracias por enviarnos a tu Hijo Jesucristo, nuestro Salvador y Eucaristía a través del Espíritu Santo, un solo Dios por los siglos de los siglos. Amén.

### **Holy Name Church Attendance Procedures**

We ask for Christian patience and understanding during these difficult and challenging times. It is imperative that each of us strictly abide by these procedures to prevent contamination and/or spread of the Covid-19 to one another.

For the safety of all, these procedures are mandatory and must be adhered to for Mass attendance. Anyone who cannot comply are asked to leave. Holy Name Catholic Church Procedures will follow the Archdiocese of San Antonio Guidelines for Mass Attendees and are as follows:

- 1. If you are feeling sick, we ask that you stay safe at home. We highly encourage those who are most vulnerable to continue to participate in mass via live stream or website (holynamesusa.org).**
- 2. Wash hands thoroughly before coming to the church.**
- 3. Everyone must have their temperature taken before entering the church when applicable. Anyone with a fever will not be allowed entry. Anyone coughing or sneezing may not be allowed entry.**
- 4. All must wear a face mask that covers both nose and mouth before entering the church and throughout the Mass. No exceptions except for infant children.**
- 5. Bring hand sanitizer, your own missal or other mass aids to church.**
- 6. Always maintain 6 feet between you and others not in your cohabitating family.**
- 7. Follow the instructions of the ushers as you enter and leave the Church.**
- 8. When guided by the ushers to receive communion, is the only time you may temporarily reposition your mask to consume the Host, then immediately recover.**
- 9. Seating will be on a first come first served basis for now, Mass capacity will be dependent on the number of attendees in each group, we can Safely seat.**
- 10. Unfortunately, there will be no saving of seats. We ask that you ensure you enter with whomever you want to sit with. Once seated we cannot allow anyone to reposition because it will compromise the 6-foot separation distance.**
- 11. After receiving Communion, we need everyone to maintain in their seats until the ushers direct your row towards the exits. We ask that you please be patient, as we are doing our best to maintain exiting in an orderly manner.**
- 12. Finally, we ask that you be very patient with us, especially our volunteers who did not establish these procedures, but are only following them. They are giving of their time to help us conduct Mass, without volunteers this Mass would not happen. Thank you**


