**Spirituality of the Readings**  
**24th Sunday of Ordinary Time (C)**  
**September 11, 2022**

**The Prodigal Us**  
**A ridiculous story.**

Who would be dumb enough to adore something they have constructed with their own hands! Imagine worshipping a molten calf! (First Reading) Of course, we do have our beautiful houses, refrigerators, cars, magazines and clothes, don't we? And our famous "bottom line" in business. And a low score at golf or high score at softball or hunting. And money. And cigarettes. And drink. And sex all over the place. More people in the United States watch pornography than watch sports. And we do often worship the current "stars" in Hollywood or on MTV, things we have created with our own hands. Love God above all things. Then you can love everything and everyone else as they deserve. But never mind that. In the First Reading we find God becoming quite upset because the people in ancient days put up cheap products as their God. While Moses is away, they have built a golden calf, and are making it their God. Ridiculous. God had a different idea of his relation to the people. We could sum it up as follows: What about the two-way covenant of love I have been offering you? I will be your God and you will be my people. I will love you more than you can ask or imagine. Won't you just love me in return? But they refuse and willfully run away to their paltry desires. God becomes angry, maybe in the way a parent would with a seriously disobedient child. He shouts at Moses, let me alone, then, that my wrath may blaze up against them to consume them. First Reading

A few lines later, Moses acts as a family friend. He says, Why, O Lord, should your wrath blaze up against your own people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with such great power and with so strong a hand? ... Let your blazing wrath die down; relent in punishing your people.

Just calm down, Give them some time. God agrees.

Yet they were "worshipping" false gods! Maybe you and I do not exactly worship (fall down and adore) all the man-made items that demand our time, but have you ever run away from God so you can have whatever arouses your own addictions? For sure the prodigal son (Gospel) did. He left what he felt were the "shackles" of home life and also the confining love from his father. He made himself "free"! He squandered everything on a life of dissipation, the equivalent of our many refrigerators, cars, houses, magazines and clothes. When he finally comes crawling back home, defeated, we would expect his father to say: "Oh sure, now you turn up, thinking everything will be just like it used to be. Well think again, pal." But instead his father actually runs to meet his son, embraces him and prepares a huge feast of welcome. Did the young man get what he deserved? No, he got what his father prepared for him. Entire forgiveness. God does not want to keep us from the things that attract us. He wants us to value them in due proportion. Love God above all things. Then you can love everything and everyone else as they deserve. We fail, of course, like the prodigal, and like the ancient Israelites did. So Jesus pleads for us, just as Moses pleaded. God puts his arms around us and says, "welcome, welcome, welcome. You came back! We can love one another again, can't we?" We will do our best, we say.

**Domingo XXIV del Tiempo Ordinario (Ciclo C)**  
**(11 de septiembre de 2022)**

Las lecturas de hoy giran todas ellas en torno a la misericordia divina, el retrato de Dios que jamás pudiéramos imaginar. En la primera, escuchamos cómo el pueblo hebreo se rebela contra Dios adorando un becerro de oro. El pecado merecía la destrucción del pueblo, pero ante la intercesión de Moisés, Dios lo perdona por su misericordia. En la carta primera a Timoteo, S. Pablo confiesa su historia pecadora. Pablo que había sido perseguidor violento y soberbio, se ve elegido por Dios por pura misericordia para que sea su testigo. Las tres parábolas del evangelio son llamadas parábolas de la misericordia. S. Lucas las sitúa en un contexto escandaloso para escribas y fariseos, contexto que no debiéramos pasar por alto. Jesús se ve rodeado de personas de mal vivir y conducta dudosa; todos se sienten acogidos y acuden a él publicanos y pecadores; además entraba en sus casas y comía con ellos. Todos se arremolinan para escucharle. Jesús con su conducta transgredía la ley judía alimentaria, la clave de la identidad religiosa judía. A cierta distancia, se sitúan los escribas y fariseos –ellos siempre justos y jueces de la conducta ajena– le acechaban y murmuraban, porque acogía y comía con gente pecadora. Jesús echaba por tierra la religiosidad que no sale del corazón, los guetos y la supuesta superioridad farisaica, él ha venido a buscar y a salvar lo que estaba perdido (Lc 19,10). Para los judíos el comportamiento de Jesús era subversivo y lógicamente tenía que suscitar conflictos. Los fariseos y los escribas, critican de una manera despectiva el comportamiento de Jesús, ese acoge a los pecadores y come con ellos. Jesús no entra en discusiones, sino que les expone las tres parábolas intentando que reflexionen, que interpreten de manera distinta el comportamiento que tanto les escandaliza. Jesús justifica su conducta reivindicando el amor de Dios Padre hacia todos los pecadores. El comportamiento de Jesús es el mismo que Dios Padre tiene con todos los hombres.

Giran las parábolas en torno a la búsqueda de lo perdido (oveja, moneda, el hijo perdido) y la alegría compartida en el momento del encuentro. Todos somos la oveja, la moneda, el hijo pródigo y el hijo mayor. La vuelta a Dios solo se puede hacer desde una reflexión seria, tratando de entrar dentro de nosotros mismos como lo hizo el Hijo pródigo. Para volver a Dios necesitamos humildad para reconocer nuestra situación. Solo entrando en nosotros mismos y con humildad podemos reconocer nuestra realidad auténtica ante Dios; en caso contrario, si no se es el Hijo pródigo que marcha de la casa paterna, sí seremos el hijo mayor que nunca ha desobedecido: tantos años como te sirvo sin desobedecer nunca una orden tuya... , porque somos cumplidores y jueces de la religiosidad ajena, pero no amamos a Dios. Nos falta la alegría auténtica, la alegría de sentirnos amados por Dios y de amar a Dios y de amar a todas las personas como Dios. Nos falta la alegría de sentirnos acogidos por Dios y de saber que Dios siempre nos perdona compartiendo su alegría en ambiente de fiesta. Si no nos produce alegría encontrar la moneda, la oveja, el hermano, evidencia también nuestra pérdida. Nos sentimos los dueños, engraidos en la casa paterna, cuando en realidad somos los niños caprichosos de la casa, incapaces de alegrarse de la vuelta del hermano y de compartir la alegría de Dios, Padre de todos. No estaría de más que meditáramos profundamente la actitud del hijo mayor en la parábola. El hijo mayor, no podía comprender la conducta del padre para con el menor, estaba más lejos de Dios que su hermano arrepentido. Él es imagen de quienes, creyéndose usufructuarios exclusivos del reino de Dios, se sienten ofendidos cuando Dios es más misericordioso que ellos. Por eso el hijo "justo", incapaz de alegrarse por la vuelta del hermano, recibe una reconversión, mientras su hermano pecador goza de la dicha de ser acogido festivamente por su padre.

Sentirse "convertido" es el pecado que nos da "autoridad" para desautorizar al mismo Dios misericordioso; creernos los "buenos hijos" nos da la seguridad para juzgar a todo el que no piense y actúe como nosotros, incluso para manipular al Padre; es sentirse convertidos sin necesidad de conversión. No hay conversión sin humildad, sin verdad, sin discernimiento, sin amor. Todos somos hijos necesitados permanentemente del amor de Dios, de amar como Dios nos ama. No olvidemos que esta parábola fue dirigida a los fariseos.

¿Nos sentimos perdonados por Dios realmente? Solamente si nos sentimos perdonados, seremos capaces de perdonar. La parábola del Padre lleno de amor es la historia de cada persona. Pidamos con el salmista que el Señor cree en nosotros un corazón puro, un corazón nuevo.

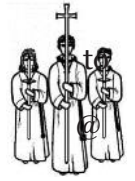
