September 25, 2022
"Afflicting the Comfortable"**

My Brothers and Sisters in the Lord –

All of us know someone who worked hard all their life, saving money for retirement. Then they planned to travel and really enjoy themselves. But soon after that retirement, they died – or, their spouse died. And all their plans came to nothing! We have also known

people who spend a great deal on themselves and on their lifestyles. "You can't take it with you!" they say – as they continue living the "good life". In contrast to our First World lives and lifestyles – there are those of the Third World. There are over 860 million who live in extreme poverty – on less than \$1.90 a day – And over 34 million of these live in our own country! We can ask ourselves, why we are so richly blessed in comparison to those millions of others? Does God care for us more than He cares for them? Moreover, if they are part of the Human Family God created – do we have any responsibility toward them?

The Gospel of Luke certainly doesn't have encouraging words for most people in First World countries today. Jesus came to bring healing, mercy, forgiveness, and love to the world. He came to comfort the afflicted. But Jesus also came to afflict the comfortable! And today's parable doesn't mince words in the story of the rich man and Lazarus. What is so unsettling is that the rich man is so surprised with the outcome. His case was hopeless – but he was concerned about his brothers. So, if Lazarus returned to warn them – surely they would change! Then Abraham reminded him that his brothers had the Law of Moses and the teaching of all the prophets – That is more than enough to guide their lives. Nevertheless, the rich man realized that this was his own failure – and it would also be theirs. That is the reason for someone to come back from the dead and warn them.

Yet, even that would not be enough. They had hardened their hearts against anything and anyone who would challenge them – their way of thinking – or their lifestyle. Nothing would change them – not even the return of Lazarus! Jesus was speaking to the Pharisees and all the self-righteous of his own day. And we know from scriptural history, that his own Resurrection and return did nothing to change them. They even hunted down and put to death many of the leaders of the early Christian community! They were, truly, the complacent in Israel whom Amos inveighed against in today's Old Testament scripture! So, what about us? Some of us are really struggling to "make ends meet" in these inflationary and upsetting times. Others are "OK" for the time being. Still, others are well-off and continuing to "enjoy life". Nevertheless, there are still many Lazaruses in our own community.

Many of these modern-day Lazaruses are drug-addicted – and even dangerous. But not all of them are. Many – may be most – are not. So are we reaching out? Are we doing anything to help them? Certainly, they deserve more than just the "scraps" from our table! If we have been blessed, then it is our responsibility to share those blessings with those who have less. Otherwise, we are failing – as are so many others in our country who serve no god but themselves. Brothers and Sisters, any of us could very well have been one of the hundreds of millions of poor in the world. Fortunately, we are not. So let us not squander our resources on ourselves. Let us praise, bless, and thank God for what we have been given. But, let us never forget that what we possess has been given to us in trust. It is our obligation and duty to better the world by lifting up the lives of those who have little – or nothing at all! Let us pray that we do this with great generosity!

Domingo XXI Tiempo Ordinario.

Los temas de reflexión que las lecturas de este domingo nos proponen, son continuación de los del domingo pasado: la denuncia profética de Amós, su poner en evidencia el modo de vida de algunos, que adoraban a Yavhé en el Templo, cumplían con todo lo establecido por la ley y se olvidaban después incomprensiblemente de otras obligaciones que deberían llevar a la práctica en su vida diaria. De hecho, este texto del capítulo sexto del profeta Amós es uno de los más duros de todo el Antiguo Testamento contra los que viven rodeados de lujos y comodidades a espaldas del sufrimiento de los oprimidos. Precisamente es eso lo que denuncia: vivir en lo uno a ciegas de lo otro. Desentenderse del sufrimiento del hermano; no preocuparse más allá del bienestar de uno mismo, hacer la vista gorda ante el dolor ajeno, no ser solidario con quien vive en inferioridad de condiciones, ignorar la necesidad, todo esto, son cosas que Dios reprueba. Y es que no puedo estar yo rodeado de lujo, y hacer oídos sordos al clamor del hermano necesitado. Es verdad que muchas veces nuestra excusa, es que ya tenemos bastante con los problemas de cada uno para preocuparnos de los demás, pero si lo pensamos un poco, es esta una excusa muy poco cristiana, ya que la fe en nuestro Dios que es sobre todo amor nos exige que a pesar de que lo nuestro nos lleve su tiempo, hay que dejar un poco también para los demás. Tenemos que ser un poco más desprendidos, y estar atentos a las dificultades y problemas de los que nos rodean. Nuestro egoísmo, nuestra falta de amor nos lleva a dejar de lado lo que pasa más allá de la puerta de nuestra casa. Cuantas veces decimos, llevo tiempo viviendo al lado de esta persona, y no la conozco de nada. Vivimos exclusivamente preocupados de lo nuestro, siendo muy poco sensibles a las necesidades de los otros. La lectura de hoy nos invita a repensar esto.

El ejemplo que nos trae el evangelio, no por muy conocido resulta menos incisivo. El hombre que se sentía a gusto como estaba, no escucha a Dios ni escucha al pobre, su mente y su corazón están puestos en exclusiva en las riquezas y en la comodidad, y no le importa nada más, no es que sólo no le importe es que no necesita más. Vivir en el seguimiento de Jesús es para nosotros una tensión permanente. La tensión entre buscar la propia voluntad y la voluntad de Dios, sobre todo cuando ambas no coinciden. Nos movemos en este dilema continuo. Esto se manifiesta en una serie de situaciones muy concretas, por ejemplo: vivir cómodamente o vivir en actitud de servicio, o sea, yo quiero vivir cómodamente y el Señor me pide vivir en actitud de servicio; vivir mi vida o vivir para los otros; vivir pegado a la vida temporal o vivir en la búsqueda del más allá; escuchar las voces que me complacen, que me adulan o escuchar la llamada permanente a la conversión que Dios me hace. Podríamos añadir otras muchas situaciones. Continuamente nuestra vida se mueve en esta disyuntiva a la hora de decidirse, es verdad que es esta una lucha continua, pero nuestra opción por Jesús nos exige que revisemos cuáles son nuestras opciones prioritarias. Decidirnos por Él nos exige un poco más de compromiso a la hora de saber lo que tenemos que hacer. Decidirnos por Él, significará más de una vez dejar de lado lo que a mí me gustaría hacer y escoger el camino que Él me propone. Ojalá, a la hora de tomar esta decisión tengamos un poco más en cuenta lo que significa sacrificio, esfuerzo y compromiso personal y dejemos de lado lo que significa, dejadez, pesimismo, pereza y desilusión. Esto nos viene muy bien ahora que estamos apunto de comenzar un nuevo curso pastoral. Seguimos con la sensibilización de la que hemos hablado para lograr lo que hemos venido diciendo estos domingos: que no puedo seguir haciendo lo de siempre, que el Señor seguro me pide que tengo hacer algo más y mejor. Le pedimos al Señor, que nos de la fuerza suficiente para convencernos de todo esto, se lo pedimos los unos para los otros. Al tiempo que pedimos por los que menos tienen, por los pobres, por los que están o se sienten abandonados de todos, por los que más necesitan de nosotros y nosotros incomprensiblemente les damos de lado.
