Solemnity of All Saints November 1, 2020

Reading I: Revelation 7:2-4
Responsorial Psalm
24:1bc-2,3-4ab,5-6
Reading II: 1 John 3:1-3
Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12a

Theme: *“Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven”* (Gospel).

Do you believe that you can be a saint? In the Church, we have a process of declaring one a saint worthy of veneration. *“The process of declaring one a saint in the Catholic Church is called canonization. The canonization process is a canonical (Church law) procedure by which the Church through the Pope solemnly declares a Catholic to be united with God in heaven, an intercessory to God on behalf of the living, and worthy of public and universal veneration”* (USCCB).

However, we do not need to be canonized to be a saint. The sanctifying effect of the sacraments for example guarantees the constant state of grace and therefore reinstates us in our original being, that is, being children of God. In the first letter of John, this is what we read, *“beloved, see what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God. Yet so we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God’s children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed”* (1 John 3:1). Through baptism, the sacraments and more especially the devotion to the Holy Eucharist unite us to God in Christ Jesus who redeemed us by his death and resurrection.

In the gospel today, Jesus presents the nine beatitudes, the spoken declaration of the blessedness of a person. It is also the central teaching of our Lord. The first four beatitudes, *“Blessed are the poor, the mourners, the meek, the hungry and thirsty”* are not the ideal state where happiness and joy can be found. Yet the Lord makes possible these conditions of life a blessed opportunity to prosper in spirit. The next three beatitudes offer us a more challenging way of life. Blessed are the merciful, the clean of heart, and the peacemakers are not easy to practice but when we embrace them, we become what the Lord called blessed. The last two beatitudes are the result of faith that is lived in a world that rejects it, *“Blessed are those persecuted for righteousness sake and blessed are you when they insult you in the name of the Lord.”* Now we know that we can be saints if we live up to the beatitudes of the Lord!

Let us pray: God our Father grant us faith to fully receive the teachings of your Son Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever, Amen.

Solemnidad de todos los santos 1 de noviembre de 2020

Lectura I: Apocalipsis 7: 2-4
Salmo responsorial 24: 1bc-2,3-4ab, 5-6
Lectura II: 1 Juan 3: 1-3
Evangelio: Mateo 5: 1-12a

Tema: *“Alégrate y alégrate, porque tu recompensa será grande en los cielos”* (Evangelio).

¿Crees que puedes ser santo? En la Iglesia, tenemos un proceso de declarar a uno un santo digno de veneración. *“El proceso de declarar a alguien santo en la Iglesia Católica se llama canonización. El proceso de canonización es un procedimiento canónico (derecho de la Iglesia) mediante el cual la Iglesia a través del Papa declara solemnemente que un católico está unido con Dios en el cielo, un intercesor a Dios en nombre de los vivos y digno de veneración pública y universal”* (USCCB).

Sin embargo, no necesitamos ser canonizados para ser santos. El efecto santificador de los sacramentos, por ejemplo, garantiza el constante estado de gracia y, por tanto, nos reintegra a nuestro ser original, es decir, a ser hijos de Dios. En la primera carta de Juan, esto es lo que leemos, *“amados, mirad el amor que nos ha dado el Padre para que seamos llamados hijos de Dios. Sin embargo, así somos. La razón por la que el mundo no nos conoce es que no lo conoció a él. Amados, ahora somos hijos de Dios; lo que seremos aún no ha sido revelado”* (1 Juan 3: 1). Mediante el bautismo, los sacramentos y más especialmente la devoción a la Sagrada Eucaristía nos unen a Dios en Cristo Jesús que nos redimió con su muerte y resurrección.

En el evangelio de hoy, Jesús presenta las nueve bienaventuranzas, la declaración hablada de la bienaventuranza de una persona. También es la enseñanza central de nuestro Señor. Las primeras cuatro bienaventuranzas, *“Bienaventurados los pobres, los dolientes, los mansos, los hambrientos y sedientos”* no son el estado ideal donde se puede encontrar la felicidad y la alegría. Sin embargo, el Señor hace posible que estas condiciones de vida sean una bendita oportunidad para prosperar en espíritu. Las siguientes tres bienaventuranzas nos ofrecen una forma de vida más desafiante. Bienaventurados los misericordiosos, los limpios de corazón, y los pacificadores no son fáciles de practicar, pero cuando los abrazamos, nos convertimos en lo que el Señor llamó bienaventurados. Las dos últimas bienaventuranzas son fruto de la fe que se vive en un mundo que la rechaza: *“Bienaventurados los perseguidos por causa de la justicia y benditos tú cuando te insultan en el nombre del Señor.”* ¡Ahora sabemos que podemos ser santos si vivimos a la altura de las bienaventuranzas del Señor!

Oremos: Dios nuestro Padre, concédenos la fe para recibir plenamente las enseñanzas de tu Hijo Jesucristo y el Espíritu Santo, un solo Dios por los siglos de los siglos, Amén.

Holy Name Church Attendance Procedures

We ask for Christian patience and understanding during these difficult and challenging times. It is imperative that each of us strictly abide by these procedures to prevent contamination and/or spread of the Covid-19 to one another.

For the safety of all, these procedures are mandatory and must be adhered to for Mass attendance. Anyone who cannot comply are asked to leave. Holy Name Catholic Church Procedures will follow the Archdiocese of San Antonio Guidelines for Mass Attendees and are as follows:

- 1. If you are feeling sick, we ask that you stay safe at home. We highly encourage those who are most vulnerable to continue to participate in mass via live stream or website (holynameusa.org).**
- 2. Wash hands thoroughly before coming to the church.**
- 3. Everyone must have their temperature taken before entering the church when applicable. Anyone with a fever will not be allowed entry. Anyone coughing or sneezing may not be allowed entry.**
- 4. All must wear a face mask that covers both nose and mouth before entering the church and throughout the Mass. No exceptions except for infant children.**
- 5. Bring hand sanitizer, your own missal or other mass aids to church.**
- 6. Always maintain 6 feet between you and others not in your cohabitating family.**
- 7. Follow the instructions of the ushers as you enter and leave the Church.**
- 8. When guided by the ushers to receive communion, wear your mask receiving Communion, only removing it or lifting the mask up to consume Jesus away from the Priest or Deacon.**
- 9. Seating will be on a first come first served basis for now, Mass capacity will be dependent on the number of attendees in each group, we can Safely seat.**
- 10. Unfortunately, there will be no saving of seats. We ask that you ensure you enter with whomever you want to sit with. Once seated we cannot allow anyone to reposition because it will compromise the 6-foot separation distance.**
- 11. After receiving Communion, we need everyone to maintain in their seats until the ushers direct your row towards the exits. We ask that you please be patient, as we are doing our best to maintain exiting in an orderly manner.**
- 12. Finally, we ask that you be very patient with us, especially our volunteers who did not establish these procedures, but are only following them. They are giving of their time to help us conduct Mass, without volunteers this Mass would not happen. Thank you.**

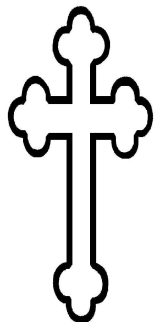

The Catholic roots of Halloween, the Vigil of All Saints' Day

In the modern world, and especially in English speaking countries, Halloween has become one of the most important holidays of the year, with millions of children and adults dressing up as their favourite heroes, superstars, ghouls and goblins.

While some people have connected Halloween to earlier pagan celebrations of the new year, Halloween actually has significant Catholic roots. The name itself comes from All Hallow's Eve – that is, the Vigil of All Saints' Day, when Catholics remember those who have gone before us to enter our heavenly home. Immediately afterwards, on November 2, the Church commemorates all the faithful departed still detained in Purgatory, and prays in suffrage for them.

The memory of those who have gone before us naturally leads to thoughts of mortality, and the liturgical focus on the end times during this period of the Church year adds to the atmosphere of gloom.

Vatican News spoke with Dr Marcel Brown, of the Alcuin Institute for Catholic Culture in Tulsa, about the Catholic roots of Halloween. "The feast of Halloween is one of those feasts on the Catholic calendar that is celebrated on the eve of a great solemnity", he said. Dr Brown explained that the word Halloween refers to the Feast of All Saints. The word itself is taken an older English term, "hallows," meaning "holy"; and "e'en", a truncation of the word evening, in reference to the Vigil of the feast. "So really, Halloween is the feast of the celebration of the feast of All Hallows", he said. "So it's a day when Catholics celebrate the triumph of the Church in heaven, and the lives of the saints on earth".

He continued, "So just as we commemorate the feast of All Saints on November 1st, beginning with All Hallows' Eve on Halloween, we also think about and turn our minds really, to the last things: death, judgment, heaven, and hell. And really our focus should be, since we all must die and are destined to judgment, how then we to live?"

"Let us make this year's celebration", he says, "an act of true devotion to God, whose saints give us hope that we too may one day enter into the Kingdom prepared for God's holy ones from the beginning of time".
