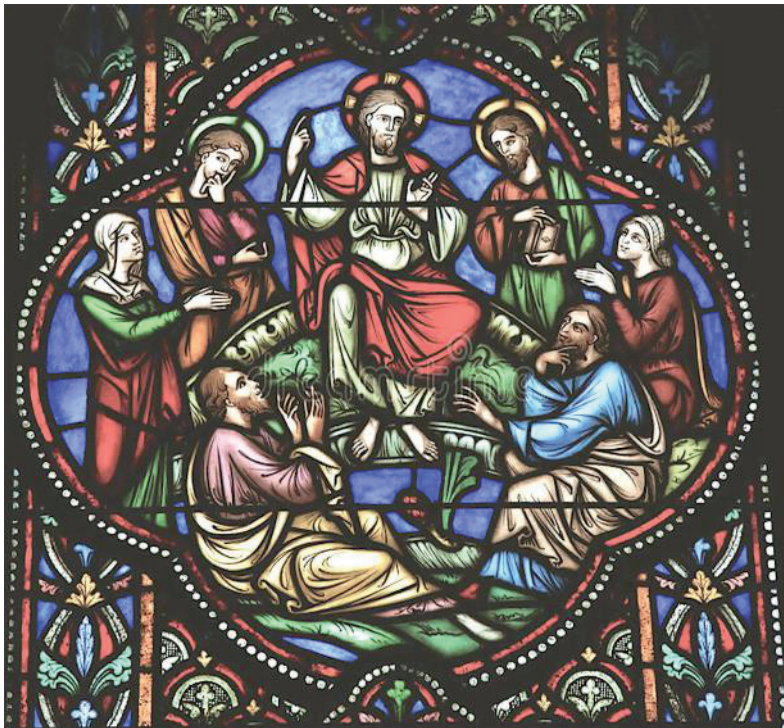

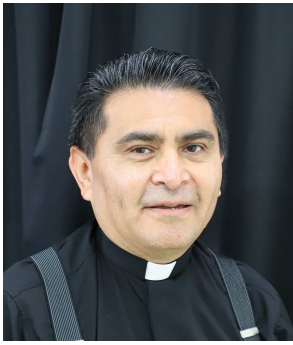

Spirituality of the Readings
13th Sunday of Ordinary Time
Year (A)
July 2, 2023

We need to reflect this weekend
He Said What?

Had you ever noticed the
number of flat-out contradictions
in scripture? For example,

- the last shall be first;
- lose your life to find it;
- take the lowest seat if you want to have the highest;
- the Son of Man came to serve, not to be served;
- a virgin will conceive;
- an old woman with an old husband will give birth to a child. and so on.

We might have said that if we want to be first, we would have to get into the front of the line, not the end. And, if we want to be alive, we must make some moves not to lose our lives. And so on. These are common sense, aren't they? Instead, this Sunday's readings are introducing us, gently and partially, to ways in which such common sense opinions do not go deep enough. Try this on: We have to be like lifeless, empty earthen vessels, so that God can pour life and love into us. In the First Reading a distinguished lady in the little village of Schunem shows great hospitality to the prophet Elisha, even to the point of building and furnishing a little room on the second floor of her house, with a bed, table, chair, and lamp for him for whenever he visits. Another contradiction: she is childless, yet Elisha promises that in one year she will be fondling her own baby son. She is shocked. But the promise comes true. Then, when the boy becomes a young man, he suddenly dies (2 Kings 4:18-37). Elisha comes from twenty miles away and brings him back to life. Life is given twice where there was no hope of life: death triumphing but life restored. It is contradictory, but is this the way of the Lord?

Then in the Second Reading, St. Paul writes to the Church in Rome that they are baptized into Christ's death and are buried with him!

A grim statement. But then Paul says, if we die with Christ, we shall also live with him, shall live a life in God (Second Reading).
Die in order to live?

In the Gospel Jesus makes a most enigmatic, not to say contradictory, statement: "Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." No matter how we try to explain away that statement and neuter its content, it still means what it says. Losing your life is the only way to possess it. Letting go is the only way to hold on. How can such contrary claims simultaneously be true?

I want to suggest a metaphor. A glass has to start out empty in order to succeed as a glass. If it is sealed up,

or if it is solid, or if it is already full, nothing can be poured in.

Does this sound like one more contradiction? No. A container has to be empty if it is to be filled.

The same goes for us. We have to be like empty earthen vessels, so that God can pour life and love into us. This is the source of all the "contradictions" in the Gospels and certainly in the readings this Sunday.

We have to empty out if we are to be filled up with God's gifts.

La Espiritualidad de las Lecturas
Decimotercero domingo
del Tiempo Ordinario A
2 de julio, 2023

Hacia Jerusalén

Jesús está en marcha y ya no va a volver atrás. Es feroz en el Evangelio para este domingo y a veces las lecturas nos alarman. El "regaña" a los discípulos. Grita "Deja a los muertos sepultar a sus muertos" cuando un hombre quiere dar sepultura a su padre antes de seguir a Jesús. El va rápido, y su actitud es intensa.

Ya hemos oído hablar antes del ministerio público de Jesús, durante los tiempos litúrgicos antes de la Cuaresma/ la Pascua. Había regresado del desierto lleno del Espíritu Santo, y se dirigió directamente a Nazaret, su pueblo natal, listo para predicar su misión. Sus propios vecinos lo rechazaron fuertemente: intentaron despeñarle de la cima de un monte. Esta era la primera sección del Evangelio según san Lucas, que los estudiosos conocen como "El Ministerio en Galilea" (san Lucas 3: 1-9; 50), el tema de nuestras escrituras sagradas dominicales (con la excepción de las lecturas para la Cuaresma y la Pascua). Ahora, empieza una nueva sección del evangelio de san Lucas, que se llama "El viaje a Jerusalén" (san Lucas 9: 51-19:28). Prepárate para ella. Ahora es la gente de los pueblos samaritanos que lo rechaza cuando pasa por ahí. Había enviado delante de sí a mensajeros para "preparar al público," para decirlo así, pero ya que los judíos y los samaritanos se tenían enemistad, no quisieron recibirle.

Según san Lucas, la verdadera razón es que ya sabían que "subía a Jerusalén."

Considera por un momento la frase, "subir a Jerusalén." La subida es literal, ya que Jerusalén está ubicado sobre un cerro. Pero Lucas quería también el sentido metafórico. Jesús estaba ya decidido a subir hasta la cruz. La palabra griega que Lucas usa para decir "subir" es la misma palabra que aparece en el Segundo Libro

de los Reyes para la ascensión del profeta Elías al cielo. "He aquí que un carro de fuego, con caballos de fuego, separó al uno del otro; y Elías subió al cielo en un torbellino" (2 Reyes 2: 11).

La subida de Jesús no será por medio de una carroza de fuego. Su ascensión será una caída súbita hacia la humillación y la muerte. El cerro de Gólgota era alto y yermo, su caída fue baja y vergonzosa.

Durante los próximos diez capítulos, Lucas va a trazar con mucho detalle esta subida a través de episodios del viaje urgente de Jesús a Jerusalén. Vemos por qué era tan duro con la gente; él sabía lo que significaría su subida a Jerusalén.

¿Quieres acompañar a este hombre en su trayecto?
¿Y si le oyes decir, "el Hijo del hombre no tiene donde reclinar su cabeza" (ni tú tampoco lo tendrás)"? O, "Ninguno que, después de haber puesto su mano en el arado, vuelve los ojos atrás, es apto para el reino de Dios."?

¿Tú y yo no nos daríamos la media vuelta para huir?
Tal vez. Pero, piénsalo.

Jesús nos dice que el Cristianismo y el Catolicismo tienen que retornos, no abrigarnos como mantas. Jesús se abre hacia Dios, más que hacia el sueño seguro, más que a los funerales familiares, aun más que a la amabilidad hacia la familia y los amigos. Ninguno de éstos es malo; al contrario, son buenos. Pero su valor más profundo procede del amor, que es el motivo fundamental de nuestras vidas y nuestros hechos, y es también la misión a la cual Jesús nos invita con tanta urgencia.

Amar a Dios, sobre todas las cosas, amar al prójimo como a nosotros mismos.


