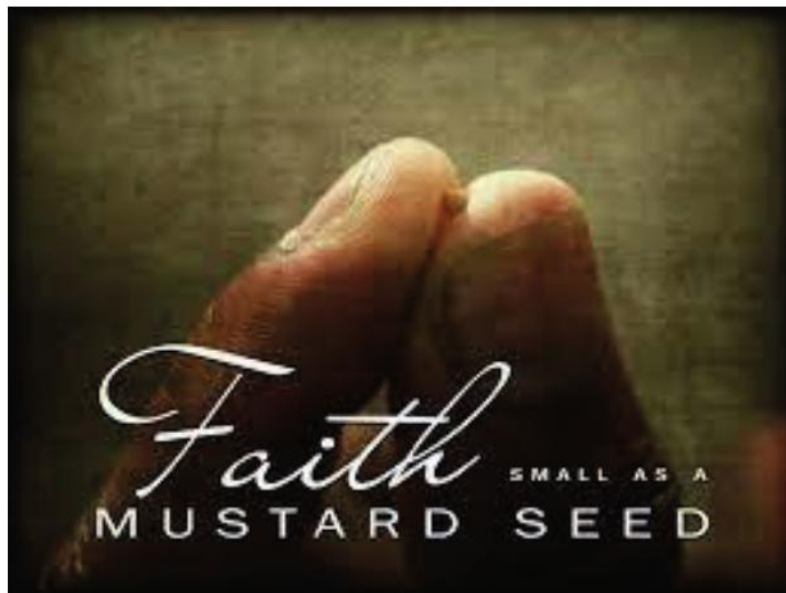

Spirituality of the Readings 27th Sunday of the Year, Year (C)

Some of the loveliest words ever spoken by Jesus are given to us by Matthew. They occur at the end of a section in which Jesus has been rejected by the religious leaders, who do not want him as their Messiah. The heart of Jesus, however, continued to go out to the people, for, as Matthew tells us: 'He had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd' (Matthew 9:36). He

invites them: 'Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls' (Matthew 11:28-30). Elsewhere Jesus promised that when he was lifted up from the earth he would draw everyone to himself and so to his Father (John 12:32), and so his invitation is being offered to every person born into this world, through the Spirit of God who is constantly gracing us all. Some of us have been given the wonderful gift of knowing Jesus and belonging to a faith-community that has within it the sacraments that nourish our souls and the rich traditions of theology and prayer that nourish our minds and hearts. Others have heard of Jesus but do not know our Catholic tradition. Others still have never known Jesus as he is and so are either ignorant of him or have rejected a false Jesus who does not satisfy their hearts. But, whoever we are, if we respond to his grace however we understand it, we have what today's gospel calls 'faith'.

There seems to be something wrong with the request made by the apostles: 'Lord, increase our faith' (Luke 17:5). They seem to be thinking of faith as a possession and security. Jesus' parable makes it clear that faith is not something that we can earn. To have faith is to be like a flower opening to the sun. It is God who pours out his love upon us all, and it is God who has placed in us the capacity to respond. We can choose to remain closed to grace, but if we follow our deepest yearnings and choose to respond, let there be nothing but gratitude in our hearts for the gift of love so lavishly offered. Jesus' concern in today's gospel is not with how much or how little faith we have. It is, rather, with how real our faith is. Are we truly open to God's love? Do we acknowledge that it is for this love that we are created and that everything we do that is of value comes from grace? Jesus picks up a mustard seed – the tiniest seed he can find (much smaller than a pin-head), and he tells them that if they have real faith, though it appears as insignificant as this seed, everything will be possible for them, for it will not be they who are doing it, it will be God, the source of all life, for whom nothing is impossible. We attend to what God is saying to us. Since God is love, the fruit of faith is always love. There is no other sign of its presence. 'A new commandment I give you', says Jesus, 'love one another as I have loved you ... If you love me you will keep my commandments ... and my Father will love you, and we will come to you and make our home with you' (John 13:34; 14:15,23).

The psalm warns us not to harden our hearts. If life has hardened them, let us remember God's promise: 'A new heart I will give you, and a new spirit I will put within you, and I will remove from your body the heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh' (Ezekiel 36:26). We were all given a share in Christ's faith – a share in his response to his Father's love – at our baptism. In today's second reading Paul reminds Timothy to fan that gift into a flame. In other words, to get on with a life of love. 'You have been trusted to look after something precious. Guard it with the help of the Holy Spirit who lives in us' (2 Timothy 1:14). Though it is as tiny as a mustard seed, our faith will be real when it bears fruit in love. As we approach communion today, let us pray that Jesus will pour his Spirit again into us and that he will give us the gift of his faith-filled and loving heart.

Domingo XXVII del Tiempo Ordinario (Ciclo C)

La fe es el tema dominante en este domingo. El justo por su fe vivirá (v. 2,4), nos dice la primera lectura. Fe y vida si no van unidas se derrumban. La primera lectura nos ofrece la experiencia del profeta Habacuc, un hombre de fe. En su entorno, no contempla más que violencia, crímenes, rapiña, discordia (Jerusalén había sido asediado por los caldeos el año 597 a. de C.). Y el profeta no habla al pueblo en esta ocasión, sino que habla con Dios y le interpela: ¿Por qué tanto sufrimiento?, ¿hasta cuándo le pedirá auxilio sin que le escuche? (v. 1,1). Dios no deja sin respuesta las quejas de Habacuc. Dios le invita a la confianza y le responde a sus inquietudes, pero no de manera inmediata. Dios tiene una fecha en sus designios. Al profeta, como a cada uno de nosotros, nos queda confiar y esperar pacientemente el "tiempo de Dios" de acuerdo con sus planes, desconocidos por el hombre. Dios intervendrá para castigar los crímenes, las opresiones, la violencia (1.3). Al hombre le corresponde fiarse de Dios, pues el altanero no vivirá (2,4), le dice el Señor al profeta. La experiencia del profeta Habacuc, más o menos, en algún momento de la vida, es nuestra experiencia. Cuando los sufrimientos, las desgracias o las enfermedades se abalanzan sobre nosotros o sobre personas cercanas, surge la misma pregunta: ¿Por qué?, ¿por qué permite Dios...?, ¿vale la pena creer? Y nos encontramos con el silencio de Dios. Y más cuando vemos que triunfan los malvados y todo les sale bien... ¿Vale la pena seguir creyendo?... Muchas son las personas que abandonan la fe y sus prácticas religiosas por estos motivos. La Palabra de Dios nos recomienda saber esperar y anhelar el día en que se manifieste la justicia de Dios sobre este orden injusto. Dios nos ha dado una respuesta en su Hijo Jesucristo.

Diversa es la situación de los discípulos. Piden a Jesús aumento de fe (cfr. v.5). Y Jesús, una vez más, les desconcierta y desilusiona. Y es que las cosas en el Reino de Dios funcionan de manera distinta a nuestra manera de pensar. Los apóstoles piden aumento de fe, pero de nada les valdrá, porque lo que necesitan, como todos nosotros, es un poquito de la fe auténtica. Probablemente, ante las obras de Jesús, lo que le piden es una fe sensacionalista, capaz de hacer milagros, que les ahorre esfuerzos y les brinde grandes éxitos, una fe que les haga fáciles las cosas y evite el sufrimiento. Pero Jesús les desilusiona: si tuvierais fe como un granito de mostaza (v. 6). Si tuvieran un gramo de fe auténtica, aunque fuera como un grano de mostaza, su fe sería eficaz. Y Jesús les invita y nos invita a tomarnos realmente en serio esta semilla en cada uno de nosotros, por pequeña que nos parezca: a acogerla, a cultivarla, a convertirla en vida y compromiso. Lo importante no es la cantidad de fe que a uno le parece tener, sino la seriedad y responsabilidad con que uno vive la fe que sólo Dios conoce. La fe no es una doctrina, sino una experiencia radical de "confianza" en Dios. Lo importante no es que nuestra fe sea mucha o poca, sino que la tomemos en serio. La fe según la Palabra de Dios que hemos escuchado hoy debe ser:

Humilde: "No somos más que unos pobres siervos; sólo hemos hecho lo que teníamos que hacer" (v.10) ¿Qué es lo que tenemos que hacer? Servir a Dios y hacer su voluntad. Solemos enorgullecernos por nuestros logros o trabajos y el orgullo suele ir unido a la falta de fe; tal vez por ello fue por lo que los apóstoles suplican a Jesús: aumentanos la fe. S. Pablo, como hombre de fe, se sintió esclavo de Cristo. El buen servidor del evangelio no tiene más ilusión que la de servir.

La fe debe ser esperanzada. Los sufrimientos, las desgracias no pueden disminuir nuestra espera y nuestra esperanza en la intervención de Dios. No hay que dudar. La acción de Dios llegará. ¿Cuándo? ¿Cómo? Dios no permanece indiferente ante el mal en el mundo, y tiene su tiempo.

La fe debe ser también testimonial. La fe es un don que Dios nos da, y una tarea que nos encomienda. Y la fe tenemos que vivirla en las distintas circunstancias de cada día por difíciles que sean.

Ante la Palabra de Dios, debemos preguntarnos si vivimos por la fe y de la fe, si la fe mueve nuestra vida o si, por el contrario, pensamos que los demás deben estar agradecidos de nuestros trabajos o si necesitamos que nos alaben por ellos. ¿Cuál sería nuestra respuesta personal a estas preguntas? Lo primero que celebramos en la eucaristía es la muerte de Jesucristo, la mayor injusticia de la historia de la humanidad, y el mayor silencio de Dios ante la muerte injusta de su Hijo (Sí habló Dios, pero no en ese momento, sí días después y resucitando a su Hijo). Por muchos que sean nuestros problemas, podremos exigirle soluciones inmediatas o decirle como Jesucristo: Padre, si quieres aparta de mí este cáliz, pero que no se haga mi voluntad, sino la tuya (Lc 22,42).
