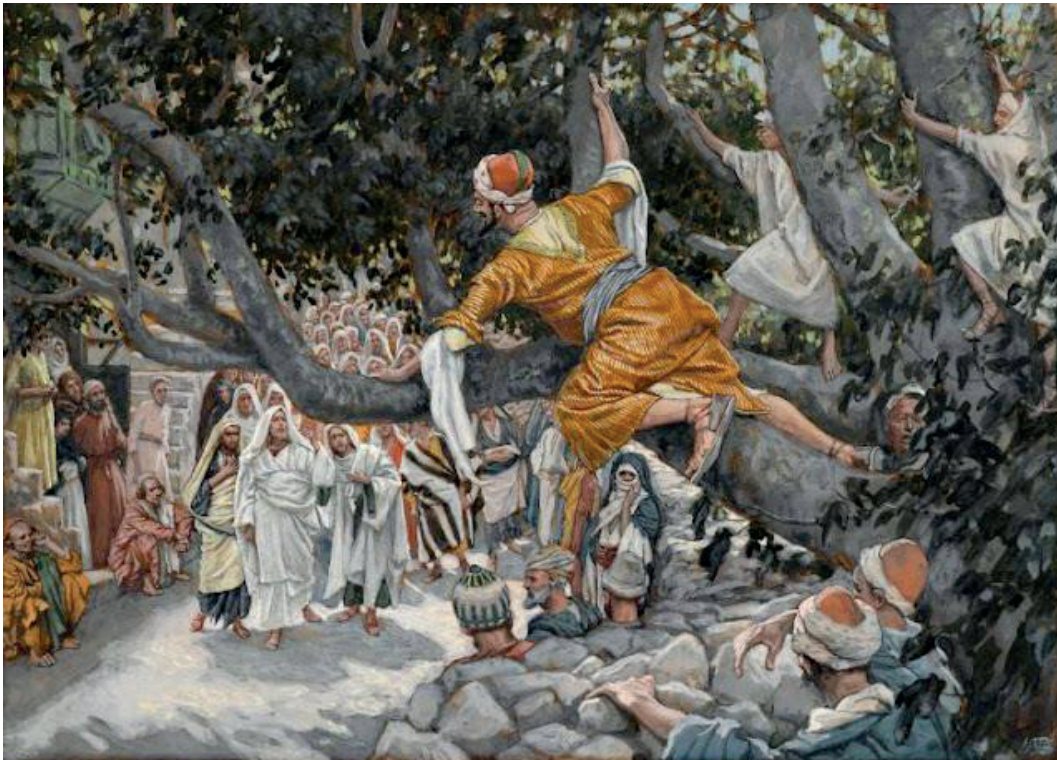

Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them, Amen.

Our universe is so tiny.



Wait! It cannot be tiny. The James Webb Space Telescope tells us just the opposite: how vast the universe is. There are billions of galaxies out there that are just like our Milky Way. And get this: each one contains literally millions or even trillions of stars.

On the other hand, the first reading says, “the whole universe is as a grain from a balance or a drop of morning dew come down upon the earth.” Obviously, that scripture writer hadn't looked through the James Webb!

Alright, is the universe large or small?

Imagine this. Picture an old-fashioned weighing scale with “pans” on either side.* Now add just a single grain of sand to one of the pans. Does the scale move? No. Now add the vast totality of all that exists (in other words, the entire universe) on one side, and imagine God on the other side.

God outweighs this universe, big time.

Get ready for the worst part. Lodged within this balance are you and me. We are the size of microbes. Impossible that so huge a God could or actually would love microorganisms like us.

Alright, but don't be discouraged. The greatest surprise in the universe is waiting:

You love all things and loathe nothing that you have made; for what you hated, you would not have fashioned. And how could a thing remain, unless you willed it; or be preserved, had it not been called forth by you? ... You spare all things because they are yours, O Lord and lover of souls, for your imperishable spirit is in all things! First reading

God's imperishable spirit is in each grain of dust and each one is beloved by God. Look, reader: you and I are beloved to God. We are cherished by the “Lord and lover of souls.”

Now, look at Zacchaeus in Sunday's Gospel. He was small in stature, so short he had to climb a tree just to see over the crowd to Jesus. And Jesus laughed out loud! He said, in effect, “Zacchaeus, come down quick. I want to have dinner in your house tonight, not out here on a tree branch!”

Zacchaeus was a tax-collector, officials who were selfish and in bad repute. Did God, therefore, withhold love and grace from him?

Not at all.

The Christ of God came in person to Zacchaeus' door and waited patiently for him to scramble down. Are you and I bold enough to have the master of the universe over to dinner tonight? Even though our clothes may be torn and dirty? Even small and unworthy as we are?

Let us try it.

I. LA PALABRA DE DIOS

El libro de la Sabiduría describe la infinita misericordia y bondad de Dios Padre sobre los hombres.

Comenzamos la lectura de la segunda carta a los Tesalonicenses que trata sobre el fin de los tiempos.

En el Evangelio, antes de llegar Jesús a Jerusalén pasó por Jericó; allí mostró una vez más su misericordia acercándose al pecador más marginado, el jefe de los recaudadores, Zaqueo, llamándolo y propiciando su conversión.

Zaqueo es presentado con discretas pinceladas humorísticas: «era pequeño de estatura», fracasa en sus intentos y queda ahogado entre «el gentío», pero su deseo de ver a Jesús es más fuerte que el respeto humano: corre aparatosamente para adelantarse al gentío y sube gateando a un árbol.

Zaqueo «trataba de ver quién era Jesús. ... Jesús ... levantó los ojos». Aquí hay como un juego de miradas: Zaqueo intentaba ver a Jesús; y «para verlo» trepó al árbol; no sospechaba que la iniciativa de ver la tiene el Señor. Y hay también un juego de subir y de bajar, físico y espiritual: Zaqueo ha subido para ver, Jesús le manda bajar; se repite el estilo salvador de Dios, proclamado treinta años antes por María.

«Es necesario que hoy me quede en tu casa». Sorprende la actitud de Jesús que toma la iniciativa. Zaqueo no le ha pedido nada, simplemente tenía curiosidad por conocer a ese Jesús de quien probablemente había oído hablar. Pero Jesús se le adelanta, se autoinvita. Él también quiere vivir contigo, entrar en tu casa, permanecer en ella. ¿Le dejas? «Estoy a la puerta llamando; si alguno me oye y abre, entraré en su casa y cenaré con él y él conmigo» (Ap 3,20). Jesús desea ante todo la intimidad contigo. Precisamente «hoy», ahora.

«Hospedarse en casa de un pecador». Una vez más Jesús rompe todas las barreras. Los fariseos –los más cumplidores y los maestros espirituales del pueblo judío– no osaban juntarse con los publicanos, pecadores públicos; cuánto menos entrar en sus casas: se contaminarían. Pero Jesús se acerca sin prejuicios, a pesar de las murmuraciones.

«Le restituí cuatro veces más». La Misná (explicación de la Ley antigua judía) decía: “la regla de restituir el doble (Cf. Ex 22,6) se aplica más frecuentemente que la de restituir el cuádruplo o el quintuplo” (Cf. Ex 21,37)«. Pero la ley antigua quedaba ya corta para el alma bien dispuesta de Zaqueo, hombre de muy buena estatura espiritual.

«Hoy ha sido la salvación de esta casa». La entrada en la casa de un publicano no contamina de impureza a Jesús; por el contrario, Jesús «contagia» a Zaqueo la salvación, porque donde entra el Salvador entra la salvación. Por eso Zaqueo, sorprendido por este amor gratuito e incondicional, «lo recibió muy contento». Y promete cambiar de vida. Sin que Jesús le exija –ni tan siquiera le insinúe– nada. Ha sido convencido por la fuerza del amor. El que los fariseos daban por perdido –hasta el punto de no acercarse a él– ha sido salvado. Pues Jesús ha venido precisamente para eso: «a buscar y a salvar lo que estaba perdido». Su sola presencia transforma; también a ti. En la medida en que le dejes entrar en tu vida irás viendo cómo toda ella se renueva.

A partir del episodio de la conversión de Zaqueo descubrimos: 1º.- a Cristo, imagen perfecta del amor misericordioso de Dios, proclamado en la primera lectura; 2º.- al pecador, que recibe el abrazo del perdón y la conversión; 3º.- la vocación del convertido: ser –como el Señor que le ha perdonado– compasivo y misericordioso.

La vida en Cristo o vida moral tiene estos mismos principios: ser perfectos como el Padre celestial es perfecto; en Cristo está el Camino, la Verdad y la vida; el Espíritu Santo, recibido en el Bautismo, nos da la dignidad de participar de la misma naturaleza divina y vivir como Él.

Month of the Holy Souls
 The Catholic Church dedicates the entire month of November to praying in a special way for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Holy Souls (also called the Faithful Departed) are members of the Church who await the purification of their souls before joining the saints in heaven for all eternity. Specifically, they are referred to as the Church Suffering (the saints in heaven are the Church Triumphant, and the faithful on earth are the Church Militant). The poor souls in purgatory cannot pray for themselves or do anything to hasten their entrance into heaven, but we can and ought to pray for them as an act of charity. The feast of the Holy Souls is November 2nd.

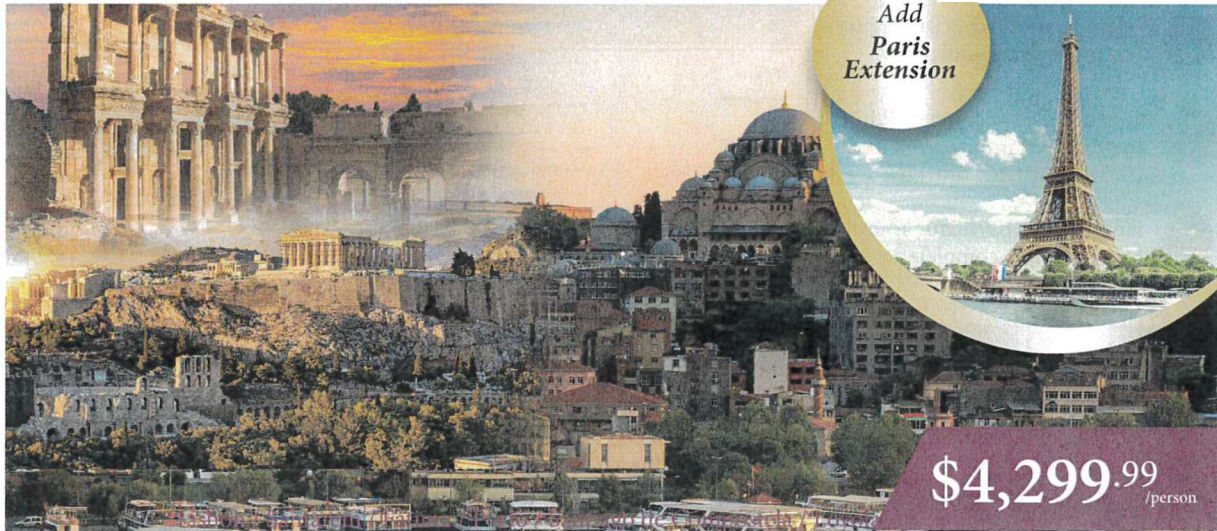
