

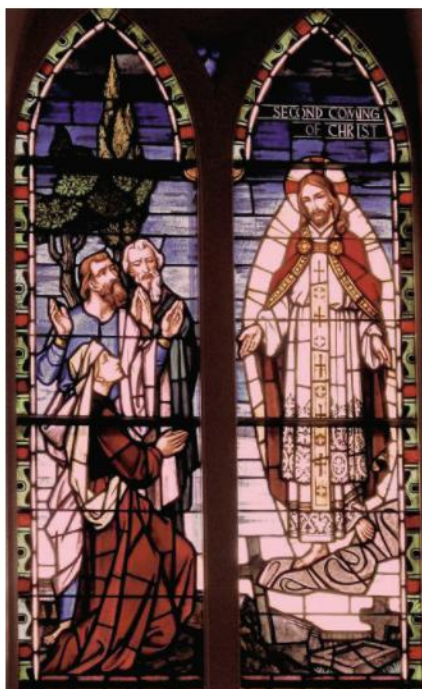

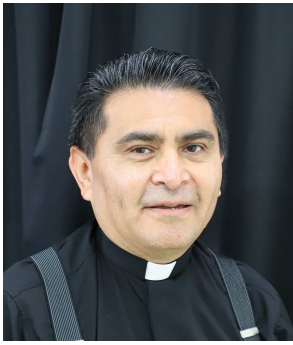

Spirituality of the Readings
First Sunday of Advent (A)
November 27, 2022

Wake Up Call

Why do we have Advent?

You say, "I don't know, it always just comes along," or, "I don't know, no one ever told me." I have heard these answers and others several times.

Especially this question: if Christ has already been born, what is this

Advent waiting about? Are we supposed to have forgotten about his birth? Strangely that is part of the answer. Our hearts get drowsy and lazy, tired out by the anxieties of daily life. Maybe we distract ourselves from our troubles by working very hard, becoming depressed, or becoming fascinated with drink, sex, out-of-control emotions, gambling, email, golf, surfing the web, pride, or (you name yours). Whatever it is for you, the very clear message of Advent is, "Settle down for a while." Open the door just a crack and let God in.

To help, the Church has a liturgical strategy. Each week's first two readings of the Advent Sundays give the carrot: usually positive, a promise of good. Then the [Gospel](#) hits you with a *big stick* to wake you up. Take the encouraging [First Reading](#) this Sunday. It reminds us of the promise God has made to his people: rightness and justice. Security. The day of the Lord will arrive, though long delayed. Peace in our day.

What a lovely thing it is to desire such a time. Too good to be true? Just pious thought? Read the [First Reading](#) now and ask yourself those questions. Spend time with them. Pray to God for help. The [Responsorial Psalm](#) will help you. It asks God to make known his ways to us, to guide us, and to teach us.

The [Second Reading](#) urges us to put God's promise of peace into action, even if we are not yet sure what it means. Love others and be loved. But then comes the [Gospel](#). It tries to wake us up, especially if the above has not helped. "But I am perfectly awake," you say. Alright then, go ahead and read the Gospel. It is the "stick."

Signs in the sun, moon, and stars, nations in dismay, the roaring of the sea and the waves, people dying of fright, and the Son of Man appearing in the clouds with power and great glory.

Terrifying?

Let yourself imagine what it might be like. Picture it scene by scene and don't worry about being exact. Just experience it. Will such a shakeup really happen? Maybe much worse is to come, judging from the state of the world today. Do you live without fear of terrorist acts, proliferating nuclear weapons, horrific climate change, a crash of the entire world economy, or the greed that fills so many hearts to overflowing in your city, in your state, your world?

If you can say "You are right, I am afraid of these," then go back to the [Responsorial Psalm](#). Beg that Christ be given birth in your soul and in so many others in this world that need it so badly.

Welcome to Advent.

Primer Domingo de Adviento Ciclo (A)

¡Velad!

Empieza [el domingo] el primer año del ciclo litúrgico trienal, llamado año A. En él nos acompaña el Evangelio de Mateo. Algunas características de este Evangelio son: la amplitud con la que se refieren las enseñanzas de Jesús (los famosos sermones, como el de la montaña), la atención a la relación Ley-Evangelio (el Evangelio es la «nueva Ley»). Se le considera como el Evangelio más «eclesial» por el relato del primado a Pedro y por el uso del término «Ecclesia», Iglesia, que no se encuentra en los otros tres Evangelios.

La palabra que destaca sobre todas, en el Evangelio de este primer domingo de Adviento, es: «Velad, pues, porque no sabéis qué día vendrá vuestro Señor... Estad preparados, porque en el momento que no penséis, vendrá el Hijo del hombre». Se pregunta a veces por qué Dios nos esconde algo tan importante como es la hora de su venida, que para cada uno de nosotros, considerado singularmente, coincide con la hora de la muerte. La respuesta tradicional es: «Para que estuviéramos alerta, sabiendo cada uno que ello puede suceder en sus días» (San Efrén el Sirio). Pero el motivo principal es que Dios nos conoce; sabe qué terrible angustia habría sido para nosotros conocer con antelación la hora exacta y asistir a su lenta e inexorable aproximación. Es lo que más atemoriza de ciertas enfermedades. Son más numerosos hoy los que mueren de afecciones imprevistas de corazón que los que mueren de «penosas enfermedades». Si embargo dan más miedo estas últimas porque nos parece que privan de esa incertidumbre que nos permite esperar.

La incertidumbre de la hora no debe llevarnos a vivir despreocupados, sino como personas vigilantes. El año litúrgico está en sus comienzos, mientras que el año civil llega a su fin. Una ocasión óptima para hacer hueco a una reflexión sabia sobre el sentido de nuestra existencia. La misma naturaleza en otoño nos invita a reflexionar sobre el tiempo que pasa. Lo que decía el poeta Giuseppe Ungaretti de los soldados en la trinchera del Carso, durante la primera guerra mundial, vale para todos los hombres: «Se está / como en otoño / en los árboles / las hojas». Esto es, a punto de caer, de un momento a otro. «El tiempo pasa y el hombre no se da cuenta», decía Dante.

Un antiguo filósofo expresó esta experiencia fundamental con una frase que se ha hecho célebre: «panta rei», o sea, todo pasa. Ocurre en la vida como en la pantalla televisiva: los programas se suceden rápidamente y cada uno anula el precedente. La pantalla sigue siendo la misma, pero las imágenes cambian. Es igual con nosotros: el mundo permanece, pero nosotros nos vamos uno tras otro. De todos los nombres, los rostros, las noticias que llenan los periódicos y los telediarios del día –de mí de ti, de todos nosotros –, ¿Qué permanecerá de aquí a algún año o década? Nada de nada. El hombre no es más que «un trazo que crea la ola en la arena del mar y que borra la ola siguiente».

Veamos qué tiene que decirnos la fe a propósito de este dato de hecho de que todo pasa. «El mundo pasa, pero quien cumple la voluntad de Dios permanece para siempre» (1 Jn 2, 17). Así que existe alguien que no pasa, Dios, y existe un modo de que nosotros no pasemos del todo: hacer la voluntad de Dios, o sea, creer, adherirnos a Dios. En esta vida somos como personas en una balsa que lleva un río en crecida a mar abierto, sin retorno. En cierto momento, la balsa pasa cerca de la orilla. El naufrago dice: «¡Ahora o nunca!», y salta a tierra firme. ¡Qué suspiro de alivio cuando siente la roca bajo sus pies! Es la sensación que experimenta frecuentemente quien llega a la fe. Podríamos recordar, como conclusión de esta reflexión, las palabras que santa Teresa de Ávila dejó como una especie de testamento espiritual: «Nada te turbe, nada te espante. Todo se pasa. Sólo Dios basta».

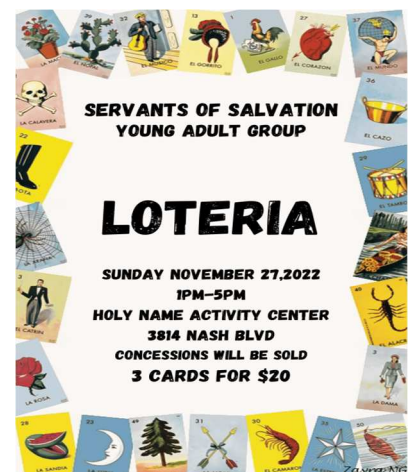
